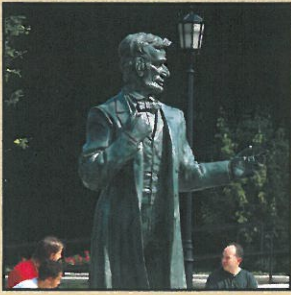


2013-14 Competitive Scholarships

The following competitive scholarships have an admission and scholarship applications deadline of December 3, 2013



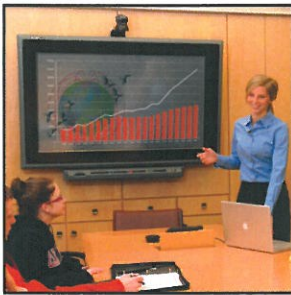
Presidential Scholarship Program

This on-campus program offers 30 scholarships ranging from full tuition, room and board, to 75% of tuition. The competition includes an impromptu essay and/or twenty-minute interview.

All students who attend the on-campus competition automatically receive a \$1,500 grant toward tuition.

Business



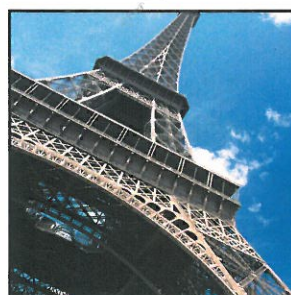
The Carthage Business Scholarship Competition was developed to provide students with an opportunity to compete for more than \$250,000 in scholarships while learning about Carthage business degrees and potential career opportunities. One full tuition and two \$22,000 per-year scholarships will be awarded to incoming students majoring in Accounting, Finance, Management and Marketing.

Math/Science



The math/science scholarship competition awards a full-tuition scholarship and two \$22,000 scholarships (each renewable) to three qualified competitors who desire to major in the fields of math, biology, chemistry, geography and earth science, physics, neuroscience or computer science. Competitors also have the opportunity to meet faculty from each major and tour the David A. Straz, Jr. Center for Natural and Social Sciences following the competition.

Modern Language



French/German/Chinese/Japanese

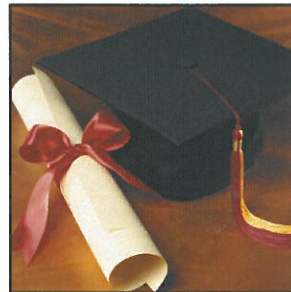
Scholarships of \$22,000 per year are awarded to students who desire to major in French, German, Chinese or Japanese (*two scholarships for French, two for German, one for Chinese and one for Japanese*). During the on-campus competition students meet with faculty members and current language majors.

Fine Arts Scholarship



Scholarships ranging from \$500-\$10,000 per year for both majors and non-majors in music and music theater, majors and minors in communication, studio art, and theatre, and majors only in graphic design.

Merit Scholarships



At the time of admission, academic scholarships are awarded to qualified freshmen based on cumulative high school grade point average (non-weighted) and ACT or SAT composite score results. The following is just a sample of what is offered:

\$5,000 each year for four years
ACT=21; GPA = 3.0+

\$8,000 each for four years
ACT=23; GPA = 3.0+

\$13,000 each for four years
ACT=30+; GPA = 3.5+

Other scholarships/non-need based financial aid may be available to you upon admission. Complete your application and send your high school transcripts and ACT/SAT score report to discover your merit award.
